Key Vocabulary

Food Chain- A sequence of feeding relationships between organisms.

Producer- Organisms that provides food for other organisms.

Producers make their own food through the process of 'photosynthesis'.

Consumer- Animals that eat other animals or plants.

Prey- The animal that gets hunted and eaten by another animal.

Predators- Animals that hunt and eat other animals.


Carnivore- A consumer (animal) that only eats other animals.

Herbivore- A consumer (animal) that only eats plants.

Omnivore- An animal that eats both plants and meat (other animals).
